## **Regular Board of Education Meeting**

The agenda for the regular BOE meeting included:

The Consent Agenda was approved consisting of

- A) Approved August 8th, 2022 Board of Education Minutes

### **Old Business:**

- The board of education was updated on the relocation of the ball fields. The Federal Land, Water, and Conservation Fund (LWCF) grant that is administered by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has awarded over \$300,000 to the project. Construction on the Concession Stand & restrooms began this week. It is anticipated that the LED Musco Lights will be installed this fall. In addition, the fencing Materials is scheduled to be delivered by late October.
- It is an exciting time as we begin to move our fields out of the river bottom, and the burning question is when will this project finally be complete. At this time, there is no set date for completion for the project, as many factors play a role in the construction process. Weather, supply availability, labor/volunteers, and, of course, money are some of the significant factors that will impact the completion of the project; however, the plan is to work as efficiently as possible to construct a high-quality facility for the community to enjoy for many years to come.

#### **New Business:**

- The Board received instructions on completing their annual board training requirements.
  - Missouri State Statute 162.203--Any school board member serving a term as of August 28, 2019, or elected or appointed after August 28, 2019, shall complete at least one hour of refresher training each year of any term in office
- The Board reviewed a draft proposal for Princeton R-V to participate in the Career Ladder Program. The Career Ladder Program supports salary supplements for teaching staff to provide compensation for additional responsibilities and voluntary efforts that are not already compensated in some form. The career advancement program is a matching fund program. Up to 60 percent of the additional salary supplement shall come from state grant funds, and the remaining amount, not less than 40 percent and any related benefit costs, comes from local revenue sources. This grant is subject to appropriation on an annual basis. The administrators will meet with Staff at the September 19<sup>th</sup> Staff Meetings and a survey will be conducted to evaluate interest in the program.
